


The Frisch school strives to provide our students with an intellectually stimulating and academically challenging environment.

# The Principal's MESSAGE

### Dear Frisch Family,

Walking through our school, the energy coursing through our hallways is palpable. Frisch is bursting with creativity, passion, and the love of learning - whether in *limmudei kodesh*, math and sciences, the humanities, fine arts, athletics, *chessed* groups, or the numerous other clubs and activities in which our students take part, and which are detailed in this Annual Report. We are a Modern Orthodox *Yeshiva* high school rooted in *Torah* and embracing the world.



One of the classic works of Modern Orthodox literature is Rabbi Joseph B. Soloveitchik's essay "The Lonely Man of Faith," which offers an astonishingly insightful and relevant interpretation of Parashat Bereishit. The work notes that two different accounts humankind's creation appear side by side within the parashah.

In the first account, God creates human beings (male and female simultaneously) and expects them to "fill the earth and subdue it" (1:28). The second account not only gives a more detailed account of the creation of Adam (made from a combination of earth and God's own breath) and Eve (from Adam's own rib), but also describes Adam's responsibility vis-à-vis the Garden of Eden: "to work it and to guard it" (2:15). According to Rabbi Soloveitchik, the dual narrative corresponds to the dual nature of human beings. The first account corresponds to the human drive to understand how the world works - to master the elements, fields of science, and other areas of intellectual endeavor, both individually and as communities of learners and achievers. The second account represents the human drive to understand why the world was created to form a connection with the divine, and to seek a

community of like-minded individuals harboring similar aspirations for spiritual and personal growth.

The Frisch School combines the core values of spirit of inquiry, religious growth, the pursuit of passion, and a culture of kindness to make for outstanding academics as well as a truly meaningful high school experience. Our facilities and academic programming are on the cutting edge of teaching methodologies and technology - from our three-track program in engineering, visual arts, or music (the only such program in any yeshiva high school), to the numerous opportunities for religious learning and spiritual growth and leadership, both in and outside the classroom. We are a yeshiva high school that truly has everything.

But what really makes Frisch so special is that this is a place where our students and faculty want to be. It is a joyful place to learn and to teach, and our students, educators, and staff love walking through the front doors each day. Crucially, we accept students who are mission-aligned, and whose presence at Frisch will contribute to the school community - regardless of their socioeconomic background. It is our hope that you will continue to generously support Frisch, and be co-creators with us in educating and shaping the next generation of young Jewish men and women.

We are proud to present The Frisch School's 2018-2019 Annual Report, which details for our stakeholders and benefactors the incredible quality and breadth of the school's academic, informal, and co-curricular learning opportunities, as well as the breakdown of our revenues and expenditures over the past year.



We are blessed to have an incredibly talented and dedicated administration and faculty, led by Rabbi Eli Ciner, who are committed to the growth and development of all our students. Each and every one of them looks to ensure that our students not only receive the very best education, but that they have the opportunity to continue to grow as individuals and as members of the Jewish

community. We have grown to be a school of over 800 students. This growth has enabled us to offer more opportunities to students for individualized learning and religious growth. This past year, we have launched new tracks in Entrepreneurship, World Languages and Beit Midrash as well as enhanced offerings in game design, statistics and composition. We have sought to expand our offerings while, at the same time, maintaining small class sizes and adding our incredibly talented faculty. This past summer has also provided an opportunity to focus on strengthening the curriculum for the existing classes and planning for extra-curricular activities and programming.

Our board of trustees are also planning for the growth of Frisch by focusing on the financial well-being of the school and the expansion required to meet the needs of our student body. We are working closely with the administration to make improvements to the facility and to invest in the educational and non-educational programming that is integral to Frisch's culture. We have begun this initiative by building a Café, which we expect will be ready in the coming weeks. This step, as well as other expansion plans, are designed to maintain the warm culture for which we are known, while continuing to upgrade the existing facilities to meet the high educational expectations of the school and

the non-educational needs of our diverse student population.

In this regard, as always, we need to partner with our parent body and the community as a whole to support our Yeshiva and to work together to meet the needs of our students. We are grateful to those who have generously contributed to one of our fundraising campaigns. This generosity allows us to provide the exceptional programming for our children. 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
# ANNUAL REPORT 2018-19 Fiscal

# Revenue and Expenses

While 90 percent of revenue was derived from tuition and fees, The Frisch School was also supported by a diverse revenue stream that included 7.1% from contributions, and 2.5% from other sources. A substantial portion of expenses is dedicated to the heart and soul of Frisch-our faculty and staff. Competitive salaries and generous opportunities for professional development enable the school to recruit and retain the very best teachers. In the coming year, we seek to upgrade and expand our facilities while continuing to invest aggressively in people and programs.


