

**Tuition Assistance Application Procedures**

We are pleased to announce that this year we will be processing our tuition assistance applications through Yeshivah Aid. Yeshivah Aid is a web based program that is currently being used by a number of yeshivas in the New York/New Jersey area. If you have children who attend any of these other yeshivas, you will only be required to fill out one application, which will be processed by each individual school.

The Tuition Assistance Committee offers financial assistance to qualified applicants who are not able to meet the cost of tuition. Tuition Assistance applications are reviewed on an annual basis. To ensure that the Yeshiva uses its resources to aid the most in need, all submissions must meet the following guidelines:

- All applications must be submitted through Yeshiva Aid.
- Families must be current on their present tuition obligations.
- For families that are divorced/separated, both parents must complete an application.
- Additional required documents and answers to the additional questions, listed on page two, should be uploaded to Yeshiva Aid.

Upon receipt of your completed application and all required documentation, the Scholarship Committee will review your application and render a decision which will be communicated to you.

If you have already completed, or are in the process of completing a 2020-2021 Yeshivah Aid application for your child/children who attend another school, log on using the same login information that you use for that school and add The Frisch School to the list of schools that you are applying to.

If this is your first time using Yeshiva Aid, click on “create an account” and complete all the information. You will then be sent an email to verify your account. Click on the link in the email and you will be directed to the Yeshiva Aid website where you can log on and begin the application process.

Submissions must include answers to all of the requested information; incomplete applications will not be processed. All documentation and supporting information must also be submitted for the application to be considered complete.

**The deadline for filing a complete application for tuition assistance is Monday, April 27, 2020. Applications submitted and/or completed after that date will be charged a \$200.00 fee.**

While Yeshivah Aid will collect all the information submitted, tuition assistance decisions will be made by the Frisch Scholarship Committee, as in the past.
